Charity The Essence of Sanctity

Before we can begin to imitate God we must know who He is, and in what His perfection consists. Holy Scripture tells us, God is charity. It does not say, "in God there is charity," but "God is charity," that is, everything in God is love. God is essentially love. Now love, even human love, is a desire for what is good; to love is to desire the good of another; it is the act by which the will is drawn toward the good. In God, the infinite Being, love is an infinite will for good, and is directed toward infinite good, the divine essence which God possesses and in which He delights. This love, which is God, is therefore an infinite, complacent love of His own infinite goodness. Yet His embrace extends even to the creatures whom He creates, to communicate to them His own Goodness and Happiness. Infinite charity, which is God, turns therefore to creatures, bringing them into existence by an act of love which does not stop at the limited good they possess, but brings them back to the infinite good, the Trinity. In other words, God creates and loves them for His own glory.

We, poor creatures, are called to share in this sublime life of love which is God, and grace has been given us for this express purpose. St. Paul exhorts us, "Be ye, therefore, followers of God, as most dear children, and walk in love."

If we are to imitate God, our supernatural life must be essentially love, that is, a love of benevolence for God and a will directed toward good, loving that infinite good which He is, and loving all creatures for Him and in Him.

Charity is so essential in the supernatural life that on its presence or absence depends the Christian's state of life or death. He who does not possess charity, does not possess sanctifying grace either, because they are absolutely inseparable, "He that loveth not, abideth in death." On the other hand, he who possesses charity, also possesses grace and shares in the life of God. "He that abideth in charity, abideth in God, and God in him," and according to St. Thomas, "Charity...unites man with God so that he no longer lives for himself but for God."

The three theological virtues, faith, hope, and charity, are infused into the soul together with sanctifying grace. God is the object of all three, but "the greatest of these is charity." It is the greatest, because without charity there can be no Christian life; the greatest, because it will never end. Further, it is the unitive force which binds us to God and is a participation in that infinite charity which is God Himself. In fact, to the Pharisee who asked which was the greatest commandment of the law, Jesus answered, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with thy whole mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment.'

When our charity is perfect, it will keep us completely united to God and will direct all our activity to Him. Hence, in the measure that a soul is dominated by charity, it is mature in the supernatural life, and is holy, to a greater or lesser degree.

O my God, without Your help, how can I obtain a treasure as precious as charity? If you want my whole life to be one of charity, it is absolutely necessary that You, charity itself, come to transform my poor soul. My faults are obstacles to Your charity which should triumph in me. Give me grace to remove these obstacles with generosity, so that Your infinite charity may take entire possession of my nothingness.

An Easy Way to Become a Saint

There are people who say that they cannot love God. When they make an act of love and say, "Oh my God, I love You," they feel nothing in their hearts to correspond to their words. Their words sound hollow, cold and false. This is what they tell us themselves. Unfortunately, this happens to many, and as a consequence, they are losing every day of their Religion.

Why cannot they love God? There are four reasons: First of all, they never ask God to help them to love Him. **Secondly,** they do not realize, as we have said, what God is,

His boundless goodness, His sweetness, mercy and love.

Thirdly, they do not understand how much He loves them. **Fourthly,** they have no idea, of all that He has done for them.

Remark that when speaking of love we do not mean an emotional love, sentimental love; we speak of the solid love of God which comes from a clear, intelligent understanding of how good and sweet God is. He Himself tells us: "Taste and see how sweet the Lord is," and again, "My yoke is sweet, My burden

How, then, can we acquire the love of God?

First of all by prayer. Let us ask God every day and in every prayer we ever say to make us love Him. Let us offer every good act we do that He may give us this, the greatest of all graces, His blessed love. Our Lord has promised over and over again and in the clearest terms to hear our prayers. He cannot break His word. Let us begin at once and ask God every day of our lives with unbounded confidence for His holy love.

Secondly, to love God we must know Him. Our concept of God must be clearly a God of infinite sweetness, mercy and love, a God of compassion, who wishes to lift us up and wipe away the stains of sin from our souls. Above all, we must look on God as our most loving Father, our dearest Friend, a God to whom we must go in all our troubles and whose help we can seek in our needs. Then, we adore God, but with an adoration of love, like the Angels in Heaven, who are burning fires of love.
