

The Little Flowers, Rosa Mystica, and the Sodality of the Blessed Virgin Mary meet on Sat., Mar. 7, at 10:00 am.

The Man Who was Thursday: A Nightmare. Is it a detective story, an adventure, philosophical tract, theological reflection or horror story? Maybe a bit of all? People have wondered at the full meaning behind Chesterton's "Thursday" since he wrote it in 1908, and will continue to do so. Considered one of Chesterton's greatest novels and most confusing, be initiated into the dialogue the book has to offer by attending this four-part lecture series by Fr Savoie. Fr Savoie promises no definitive conclusions but guarantees his enthusiasm.

Lecture One: An Undercover Detective (Chapters 1-5). March 10th in the parish hall at 7:30 pm. Other lectures to follow on April 14, May 19, and June 9.

Next week, on Mar. 11, many parishioners begin a **Novena to St. Joseph**, in preparation for the feast on Mar. 19. During this time period, flowers will be placed by the statue of St. Joseph as a sign of filial devotion to him.

A Hidden Life. Please join us in the Parish Hall on Sat., Mar. 14 from 3:00-6:30 PM, for a special afternoon showing of the film, *A Hidden Life*, (PG-13). The film is about the life of Blessed Franz Jägerstätter, a simple Austrian farmer, husband and father, who because of his refusal to fight on behalf of Nazi Germany and swear an oath to Hitler, was sentenced to prison and martyred. The film is a brilliantly meditative portrayal of the 'hidden life" and sacrifice of Blessed Franz. The cinematography is breathtaking and the acting, exceptional. A truly wonderful and worthy tribute to God's glory through this beautiful Saint of our times! "Even if I write these words with my hands in chains, I still find that much better than if my will were in chains" (Berlin, 1943). Light refreshments will be served.
