PASTOR'S COLUMN DAY OF RECOLLECTION

In the legislative documents that outline the character of the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter, as well as the rights and obligations of its members, it is prescribed that priestly members of the FSSP take a monthly day of recollection, that is, a day on which the priest steps away entirely from apostolic work and devotes himself to prayer and recollection. This is intended, along with the annual canonical retreat, to be an essential part of the ongoing spiritual formation of the priests of our society.

This requirement for our priests has been neglected in many of our parishes on account of the burdens of parish life, and has regrettably never been observed here at St. Stephen's (at least to my knowledge). The issue was raised at our convocation in the first week of January, and it is clear that our superiors desire that all our houses make real efforts to meet this requirement of our directories.

To that end I have directed the priests of the house to schedule such a day of recollection each month. It will be on a regularly occurring day for each of the priests, with allowances for flexibility on account of parish events or other obligations. The day is not intended as additional vacation, and to that end I have instructed the priests to abstain from all electronic devices in order to guard carefully the spirit of recollection. We will be obtaining a "burner phone" that priests can carry on this day (and also while on canonical retreat), so that the priest can be reached in the case of a true emergency, without having to keep their usual phone on hand and powered on.

I have invited the priests of the house to consider dedicating the spiritual fruits of these days of recollection *pro populo*, that is, for the spiritual benefit of our parishioners. They have readily agreed. I believe this will be of real advantage to our parishioners, that about one day out of every week, there will be a priest devoting himself entirely and exclusively to pray for their interests, while securing for himself also, a real spiritual renewal.

Please keep all of our priests in your prayers.

COMPLINE

Last year we introduced Compline as one of the prayers in common for the priests of the house. In practice, the time for Compline has proven to be a difficulty when trying to balance the demands of parish life, common life (especially meals in common) for the priests, and the need for common prayer. On account of this, we are going to try shifting Compline up on weekdays to just after the evening Mass.

This should have the additional benefit of allowing the faithful to be present at Compline in the evening.

<u>I remind parishioners that singing, especially of the</u> <u>psalmody, is reserved the clergy in the sanctuary</u>. When the faithful sing from the nave during the Divine Office, several difficulties are introduced: first, because they are so distant from the clergy, it is very difficult to keep pace and rhythm; second, because the clergy have spent many years chanting the psalms together, it is difficult for others to match their cadence in a natural and familiar way; a failure to do so quickly becomes disruptive.

The exception to the above would be the **Marian antiphon** at the end of Compline, which I encourage those present to join in singing. I hope soon to introduce these seasonal Marian antiphons into more general use in the parish; it would be great for everyone to learn them, even by heart.
