PASTOR'S COLUMN

ARTICLE ON SOCIAL MEDIA & ITS EFFECTS ON THE YOUTH (ESPECIALLY YOUNG LADIES)

Quite a few people have asked about the article that I used as a basis to preach from last Sunday at the 11:30 am Mass. You can find it on Substack; the author is John Haidt, and the title of the article is *Social Media is a Major Cause of the Mental Illness Epidemic in Teen Girls. Here's the Evidence.*

I think it would be good also to reproduce here some of my conclusions, namely:

- This is not simply an individual problem; it is a social problem.
- Therefore the solution must also be social.

The problem lies in the fact that if you take a young lady off of social media, her mental wellness will improve, but it will also decline because now she has become completely socially isolated. So the trick is not just to back away from social media, but also to create *healthy cohorts*; that is, groups of parents that are working together to facilitate real, healthy, face to face interaction among their children, and excluding social media *together* as a means of promoting that. As much as possible, parents should try to reproduce the kind of neighborhood environments that so many of us grew up with and perhaps took very much for granted. This is of course not at all trivial given modern circumstances (i.e. lack of children, toxic culture, crime, etc.).

It is also so important for parents to model good behavior to their children. If they are strictly kept from electronics, or at least well regulated in their use, but they observe their parents on their cell phones compulsively, it will quickly erode all the benefits of good discipline.

John Haidt is someone I was not very familiar with before reading this article. I know very little of him, so I could not endorse his work as a whole, but this article seems imminently reasonable, well researched and well argued. He is a well-reviewed author and is soon publishing a book called *The Anxious Generation* which I imagine might be very helpful for parents. I plan on looking into it once it is released in March.

LENT IS COMING

We are only two and a half weeks from the beginning of Lent. If you are new to the parish, we do encourage the more traditional fasting and abstinence throughout the course of Lent. This would mean to fast every day through Lent, except for Sundays, and also to abstain from meat. If you have never done this before, the period of *Septuagesima* is useful to start "gearing up" for Lent. Try pushing your breakfast back by a half hour or so every day until it just unites with lunch, and then start reducing lunch a little bit

until you can either get down to one meal a day, or one meal and one (or two, if necessary) smaller collations. The body is good at these adjustments, especially if it is not too sudden. Don't be intimidated! This is how *all* Catholics practiced Lent for many, many centuries. (In fact, it was even more rigorous the more you push back towards the ancient Church.)

I would also recommend giving up other luxuries with food, such as sweets and alcohol.

Lent would be a great time for everyone to detach as much as possible from social media and from cell phones in general. Consider taking up the practice of plugging cell phones in somewhere while at home and learning to just *leave them there*, only having recourse to them where there is some real necessity.

Hopefully this will open up space to establish (or renew) a good plan of life during Lent; that is, an adequate and *reasonable* schedule for prayers, devotions, duties, and recreation throughout the day.

Lent is also a time where the practice of silence, so hard to find in our days, is pre-eminently important. Detaching from cell phones will likely also be of great benefit to this.

God bless you all! The priests are praying for you that all may profit from a grace filled penitential season. Please pray for us, as well.
