IN VITRO FERTILIZATION

Recently, the Alabama Supreme Court ruled that frozen embryos have the same status as children. This ruling is consistent with Catholic teaching and the natural law. It has serious implications for the *fertility-industrial complex* in Alabama (a multi-billion dollar industry in the United States) and we can hope and pray that it will bring a swift end to the horror of IVF in that state, and elsewhere.

IVF (*in vitro fertilization*) is the practice of conceiving a child *in vitro*, literally "within the glass", referring to a test tube, petri dish, or other scientific apparatus. It is gravely immoral *in principle*, because it separates the procreative aspect of intimacy from the unitive. It reduces a child to a *product* or a *commodity*. It steals from a child the right to be conceived in an intimate act of love, and it (usually) introduces at least one third party – namely, the technician – into the process of conception.

IVF also has terrible consequences that ought to haunt us. It generates a host of embryos, which are then frozen cryogenically, held in stasis upon the good pleasure or desires of the so-called parents. Some of these poor creatures will remain "on ice" forever, or at least until "termination" (i.e. murder) at some pre-determined "expiration date". These children are quite literally reserved on a shelf in so-called "banks", just like any other commercial product, until they are deemed convenient and "wanted". They are stripped of all dignity and all rights. When (and if) they are finally designated for implantation, they often suffer long-term medical difficulties. Because the "success rate" of IVF varies dramatically by age (it can be as low as 3.9% for women over 42), multiple embryos are often transferred to the uterus to increase the odds of a successful pregnancy. Where "too many" embryos implant, selective abortion is used to "cull" the unwanted children.

IVF is a horror and a nightmare. It is not an ethical answer to fertility problems that some spouses tragically suffer.
