PASTOR'S COLUMN BR. DAMIEN a.k.a. FR. MCWHIRTER



Father is doing quite well in spite of the radical adjustment of religious life vis-à-vis priestly ministry. He has been at the monastery since mid-August and has recently been promoted from postulancy to the novitiate. As a novice, he is entitled to a religious name, given to him by the abbot: Father's religious name is Br. Mary Peter Damian. He is addressed as "Brother" during the period of novitiate, which will likely last about one year. In many respects, this period is a time of testing the monastic vocation, which is quite different from a strictly priestly vocation. Once he takes vows, I believe he will be addressed as "Father" once again. In any case he is usually called by the name "Damien"; his fuller name "Mary Peter Damien" being reserved for formal documents.

The rigorous life of the monks was on full display during my visit to them. While I was there, they would rise at 3 am (being on a solar *horarium*) and then move to another room where they have some partitions set up for privacy, as they sleep in a common room. There, they change out of their monastic sleeping robe into their habit, brush their teeth, and perhaps splash a little water on their face. By 3:15 am, all assemble in the chapel for Matins, which usually takes a little over an hour. After Matins, some priests say a private Mass, assisted by lay brothers as servers. During these Masses, the other monks go to the chapter room for private *lectio divina;* they are joined by the others at the conclusion of the private Masses. Soon enough, at the false dawn, the monks return to the chapel for Lauds. Afterwards, they have one of only two brief opportunities in the day for private work or prayer; monks may shower, or write a letter, or accomplish some other tasks at their own discretion.

This period ends and the monks return to the chapel for Prime; they sing the first half of this, then retire from the chapel to the chapter room for the recitation of the Martyrology, a reading from the Rule of St. Benedict, followed by a *ferverino* delivered by the abbot, their daily chapter, and then the conclusion of Prime. Soon after that the monks return to the chapel yet again, this time for Terce. After Terce, the monks assist at a sung Mass, and then move on to their assigned work. This is interrupted an hour or two later by Sext, which – like all the other Offices – is sung in the chapel. Afterwards the monks return to their work until None, which is followed by their meal (on normal days, this is the only meal taken by the monks – on Sundays and feast-days, they have two meals). The meal is taken in silence, with one of the monks reciting table reading from one of the front corner of the refectory.

The monks process out of the refectory after meal prayers chanting Psalm 50, returning to the chapel for Vespers. Once again, the monks have another very brief time to engage in private prayer or work, this time lasting only twenty minutes or so. Finally, they return for the last time to the chapel for Compline, after which they all retire to bed.

The life is quiet, measured, and balanced, and the monks are all kind and appear to be quite happy and healthy. Br. Damien is engaged as the assistant refectarian, so he spends most of the work time of his day slicing fruit and vegetables, preparing bread, and setting tables for the common meal.

Br. Damien sends his warm greetings to everyone and was eager to assure me that he is praying for the priests and parishioners of St. Stephen's every single day. He greatly misses all of you.
