PASTOR'S COLUMN RESURREXIT SICUT DIXIT, ALLELIUA!



REFLECTION ON THE TIMES

Earlier celebration of the Triduum mysteries reflects the practice of the Church for at least a thousand years* (one priest I spoke with who tends to have historical sources for such things gave me an early ninth-century text for a later Vigil Mass of Easter). The most usual explanation for this drift towards earlier times is: the Eucharistic fast, combined with the loss of all-night vigils kept by the Catholic faithful. The argument runs that the faithful of old would, for example, begin the Vigil ceremonies late on Saturday evening, and that these would be so prolonged as to terminate on Sunday morning. Once this kind of vigil faded from Catholic practice, it became too onerous to keep the absolute (food and water) midnight Eucharistic fast, if Masses were to begin in the afternoon or even late evening. Since the Eucharistic fast has now been practically reduced to nothing, there is "no compelling reason" to draw the Masses of the Triduum earlier. I find this argument unsatisfying because it is almost certainly incomplete: oversimplifying causation bv reducing it to one variable. I do not believe it is at all demonstrable that the Eucharistic fast was the only or even the primary reason for the drift towards earlier times.

In any case, those earlier times *did* exist for a thousand years, and the liturgical and devotional life of the Church developed and matured in *that* particular garden. All sorts of practices such as the Office of Tenebrae become difficult or impossible otherwise (*in prior years, one way we have "solved" this is by reciting only Thursday and Friday Tenebrae, neglecting Saturday entirely, and by turning Good Friday into a liturgical marathon, running Tenebrae, confessions, Stations, and the Mass of the Presanctified back-to-back for eight hours straight, with a only a short pause between Tenebrae and confessions).*

I will offer that, from the perspective of the priests, this was the most balanced and "human" schedule that we have had for the Triduum. Thursday opened with Mass, when we were at our sharpest, then allowed for quiet prayer and adoration throughout the day (and into the night), with the punctuation of evening Tenebrae. Friday, too, opened with what was most important - the Mass of the Presanctified before granting some space before afternoon Stations, and again before evening Tenebrae. Confessions were more available at several times throughout each day (instead of just once) and therefore more spread out. Tenebrae saw, by a large margin, the largest attendance that I have ever seen.

One shift I would like to make would be to add a soup & bread potluck after the Mass of the Presanctified on Friday, to make it easier for people travelling from home to stay at the parish for afternoon Stations and even Tenebrae. I would also like to extend the public veneration of the Cross to the entire afternoon. If I get feedback to this effect, pushing the Thursday and Friday Masses back to 10 am might make things easier on families. There is also the question of Saturday which the priests are considering.

I would appreciate any feedback from the faithful and I am also seeking feedback from other parish priests that are looking at this. Thank you and blessed Easter to all of you.

* You will, of course, find some counter-examples in local regions through the medieval period and even pushing into the early Tridentine era.

Youth Group meets this Fri, Apr 25 at 7 pm.


The **Rosary for Priests** (fifteen decades) will be prayed on Sat, Apr 26, after the 8:30 am Mass.
